

Wearing Their Shoes

The quote, "Walk a mile in his moccasins," has been attributed to a number of Indian tribes. It actually comes from a poem written by Mary T. Lathrap in 1895. The first verse of the poem says,

Pray, don't find fault with the man that limps, Or stumbles along the road. Unless you have worn the moccasins he wears, Or stumbled beneath the same load.

It is a lot easier to point a finger of blame at someone's blunder or analyze their problem than it is to feel their pain! "He messed up!" "She has a problem!" That really helps, doesn't it? It is kind of like saying, "'Depart in peace, be warmed and filled,' but you do not give them the things which are needed for the body, what does it profit?" (James 2:15). Instead of rushing to judgment, we need to put ourselves in the other person's shoes. Another verse of Lathrap's poem says,

There may be tears in his soles that hurt Though hidden away from view. The burden he bears placed on your back May cause you to stumble and fall, too.

How would we feel if we were in his or her situation? We need to sympathize, i.e. share and understand their feelings. Someone said, "Sympathy is your pain in my heart." The poem exhorts,

Just walk a mile in his moccasins, Before you abuse, criticize and accuse. If just for one hour, you could find a way To see through his eyes, instead of your own muse.

The apostle Paul wrote, "And be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one an-other, even as God in Christ forgave you" (Ephesians 4:32). Peter wrote, "Finally, all of you be of one mind, having compassion for one another, love as brothers, be tenderhearted, be courteous" (I Peter 3:8). In both of these passages Christians (we) are exhorted to be "tenderhearted." Tenderhearted let us be!

A Few Things That May Help Us Grow

- 1. **LIVE and WORK** to reach others each day as we are commanded to in (Matthew 28:18-20 and Mark 16:15-16).
- BE AS ENTHUSIASTIC about the church and its services as you were the day you obeyed the Gospel. Think of the excitement that would bring to the congregation if we all did this.
- 3. **COUNT YOUR BLESSINGS.** Make a list of the things you are thankful to God for and thank Him for them one by one as you pray. This will help you to be grateful (*Philippians 4:6*). It will also help you to realize your dependence on God (*Acts 17:24-25,28; John 15:5*).
- 4. MAKE & MAINTAIN A LIST OF YOUR FAULTS. Pray for forgiveness and help to overcome them as you truly strive to overcome them. This will help us see that we are really not as good as we think we are and how very much we really do need Christ. It will also help you to sympathize with the faults of others (James 5:16; Galatians 6:1-5).
- 5. **KEEP A QUIET TIME.** Set aside 30 minutes every day to spend with God in prayer, Bible study, and meditation by yourself or with your family. Spending time with God is a great blessing that we often times overlook (*Psalms 1:2; I Thessalonians 5:17; Luke 18:1*).
- 6. VISIT SOMEONE FROM THE CON-GREGATION EACH WEEK. Visit a member that you do not know very well; or a sick person; or a visitor to our services; or a weak member who needs encouragement; or someone who needs to become a Christian.
- 7. **REACH ANOTHER PERSON** Conduct a Bible class in your home once a month and invite your relatives, friends and neighbors to attend. The preacher or elders will assist you if you want them to. *Matt.* 5:12-16; James 5:20;

Daniel 12:3. There are 168 hours in a week. If you were to attend Bible Study, morning worship, and evening worship on Sundays and Bible study on Wednesday, and 30 minutes 6 days a week in Bible reading, prayer, and meditation, and conduct an hour long study once a month, you would be giving God less than 10 hours a week, leaving you 158.



A Very Special Day

Just whose day is it anyway? Don't you believe the Lord's Day ought to be given back to the Lord?

Sunday should be more than another busy, pleasure-filled, weekend play day. It ought to be more than another excuse for sleeping late and lounging about the house. It must be seen as more than another opportunity to water the grass or wash the family car.

Sunday, the first day of the week, is special. It is the Lord's Day—a day for worship.

The apostle Paul tarried seven days in Troas, until "the first day of the week," when he met with the saints of that city in worship (Acts 20:6-7). John, "the disciple whom Jesus love" wrote, "I was in the Spirit on the Lord's Day" (Rev. 1:10). And is it any wonder why? Our Lord arose from the dead on the first day of the week. The church was established on Pentecost Day, the first day of the week. This day, the Lord's Day, is more than ordinary. It is special.

Justin Martyr, one of the recognized historians of the early church, wrote near the beginning of the second century, "On Sunday a meeting is held of all who live in the cities and villages...They arise together and send up prayers."

Early disciples faced terrible persecution in gathering together for worship on the Lord's Day, yet they assembled and worshipped in spite of their adversities. According to John Fox, in his Book of Martyrs, many early Christians were burnt alive, others were dragged by their feet throughout the streets naked until they expired; some were scaled to death, many were stoned, and a great number had their brains beaten out with clubs. Nero is said to have dressed Christians in shirts made stiff with wax, fixed them to axletrees, and then set them on fire to light his garden at night.

And what of us? We have great difficulty convincing more modern saints, with no fear of physical oppression, to drive the new car down a four-lane, paved highway to a comfortable, climate-controlled building.

By the way, what will you be doing this Sunday?



Stop Complaining

The story is told of a circus owner walking into a restaurant and seeing everyone crowded around a table. On the table was an upside down pot that had a duck tap dancing on top of it. The circus owner was so impressed that he offered to buy the duck from its owner and after some negotiations he agreed to pay \$10,000 for the duck and the pot.

Three days later the circus owner returned to the restaurant in anger demanding his money be returned. He told the restaurant owner that his duck was a rip off because he had put him on that pot before an audience and he had not danced one bit. It was then that the duck's former owner asked him if he had remembered to light the candle under the pot.

While that may be one reason someone would put a lighted candle under a pot; that is not really what candles are for. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus said that candles are meant to be used to provide light to all who are in the house. That is what a light source is for, to provide illumination in the dark.

In like manner, our lives as Christians were intended not to be hidden under a pot, but rather to shine before all men so that they may see clearly the way to our heavenly Father. We are supposed to be a positive influence on all those around us—Mt.5:13-16. The problem is that at times we spend too much time complaining and grumbling about life's circumstances that our lives are anything but a shining light to those around us.

In an appropriate text for this time of year, the Apostle Paul exhorts us "to do ALL things without complaining/grumbling and disputing." (Ph.2:14). It is the complaining part that I want to focus on today. Paul says to "do all things without complaining" so that we might become blameless and without fault in the midst of a crooked and perverse world. And to "do all things without complaining" so that our lives might serve as a shining light to those living in darkness.

Jesus said, "We are the salt of the earth" and the "light of the world." Thus, all of us whether we realize it or not, have a degree of influence in the lives of others. We are all being watched by others who see what we do and hear what we say, especially if they know we are professing Christians. The question then

is not are we influencing others; it is how are we influencing others? How is the way I live life, specifically when it comes to how I deal with less than pleasant circumstances, affecting those around me?

What Paul says in essence is that our light or influence is enhanced or diminished by the way we deal with life's circumstances. How do you react to daily life and living? Life has its share of difficulties and hardships for all men; do we grumble, complain and look to find fault? Or do we, as Paul elsewhere exhorts, "rejoice always", "giving thanks in all things"—Phil.4:4, I Thess. 5:18. The manner in which we influence others depend upon how we answer this question.

What does it say to an unbelieving world when Christians are no better at handling the challenges of life without complaining than they are? It says that our relationship with God through His Son doesn't really have the positive effect in our lives that we claim it does. So regardless of what life throws at you "do all things without complaining" and you just might be the light that leads some lost soul out of the darkness.

I'm convinced that many of us may not resist the temptation to sin as we should. It's not that we want to sin, for we don't. It's just that when temptation crosses our path, we don't fight it as though we were in a life or death struggle. We may resist, but the resistance is only token.

Not long ago, a friend of mine gave a lecture in which he raised the question, "What if every time we sinned, an ugly scar appeared upon our face? How much harder would we resist sin? Good question. None of us would like to have our faces scarred. Scars to our faces would be embarrassing, affecting our relationships and our behavior. I'm sure we would tenaciously fight the temptation of sin if succumbing meant a big scar on our faces.

You see where I'm going, right? Why should we fight harder to preserve our temporal flesh than we would to preserve our eternal soul? The fact that we can't see the scars sin leaves upon us doesn't mean they're not there. Friends, resist the temptation to sin, using not just a token resistance before you succumb, but a persistence that reflects a life and death struggle.



The Thief on the Cross

The cross of Jesus stands as the central event in human history. Of all the great accomplishments of mankind, none can rival what Jesus accomplished on the cross.

That being the case, why then is the record of Jesus' death, the greatest accomplishment in human history, cluttered with peripheral information about the death of an irrelevant thief?

As an answer to that question, may I suggest that the death of the penitent thief was not an irrelevant, peripheral event, but an important part of a greater story? You see, while the cross of Jesus proclaimed the depth of God's love in that he was willing to give his only begotten Son (John 3:16), the thief's cross proclaimed the scope of God's love.

The message of the thief's cross was not intended to be a polemic point on whether one should or shouldn't obey the Lord in baptism, but rather it was a message to all of us who struggle with guilt for wasting so much of our lives in sin. It speaks to those of us who have waited much too long to surrender our lives to Jesus. It speaks to all who have little more to offer to God than an apology. The thief's cross announces that God is a God of grace and forgiveness!

I would imagine that the seemingly peripheral cross belonging to the thief was a purposeful revelation intended to give us hope. Together, both crosses announce a message of hope concerning the depth and scope of God's love.

When Worship Is Boring

How many times have you heard someone characterize worship services as "boring." In fact, how many times have you characterized worship in the same way? "Boring Worship" is a tragedy! Something must be done about it. But most of the attempts at solving this problem are futile and don't address the real problem.

Most of the efforts to eliminate "boring worship" center on how we do the things we do in worship. They center around changing up the order of worship, the type of songs we sing, varying the length of time we spend on different avenues of worship, etc. While these matters deserve to be in the discussion, they are at best, on the periphery of the discussion.

"Boring Worship" is eliminated when my spirit is prepared to worship. And when my spirit is not prepared to worship, none of the proposed solutions listed above are of any value.

Let me illustrate. When my dad died, we had a "typical funeral" for him. I've attended hundreds of funerals, and they are all conducted in just about the say way every time. For my dad's funeral to be meaningful to me, no one had to dim the lights, or shake up the way we organized the funeral so it would vary from the routine. You see, that service was meaningful to me because my spirit was engaged. I fully understood why I was there, what it was about, and how indebted I was to the one I was honoring.

Solving the problem of "Boring Worship" is not so much an issue for elders to wrestle with regarding how to change procedure, but rather, it's an issue for those who are "bored" to better prepare our inward person to honor the one who saved them.

Are there externals that can enhance our worship experience? Absolutely, just like there are some that can detract from a meaningful worship experience. But don't think that by shuffling the externals, we can eliminate "boring worship." That will only be eliminated when one's spirit is engaged.





We Need More Christians!

The other day I was mowing my yard. Seeing that my neighbor was working in his yard, I killed the engine and walked over to introduce myself. He is a kind, elderly soul that enjoys doing yard work alongside his wife. Nothing, however, could have prepared me for his closing statement before we returned to work in our yards. After finding out that I am a minister, he said, "Keep up the good work. We need more people like you to remind us about religion and what we should be doing."

My first thoughts were, What makes me so special? It was not me personally, but what I represented to this elderly gentleman. Then it dawned on me, He is right. We need more people in this world that properly represent Christ.

We need more Christians! We need more Christians, because Jesus told us to grow our numbers. "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you," (Matthew 28:18-20). Jesus wanted us to be fruitful and multiply.

We need more Christians to bring more glory to God. Christians glorify God by the lives they live. Jesus said to, "Let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven," (Matthew 5:16). If there are more Christians, there are more lights to shine, and then God gets the glory.

We need more Christians living as examples to the world. The Christian life is a journey dedicated to becoming more like Christ. It is a lifestyle that transforms us from selfish to self-less. Putting the Christian life into practice, others see our progress causing us to not only save ourselves but others too (1 Timothy 4:15-16). We positively influence the world, beginning with ourselves.

All Christians have a ministry. That ministry begins within ourselves and grows to our families, friends and the world around us. The conversion of souls and faithful living are not exclusively the role of preachers, teachers, deacons, or elders. God calls all his people to multiply, glorify, and exemplify the Christian life-style. Will you answer that call?

Counting The Cost

Becoming a Christian and living the Christian life is demanding. Those who would suggest that such is simple or easy have not read the Scriptures. Jesus said, "And whoever does not bear his cross and come after Me cannot be My disciple." ... "So likewise, whoever of you does not forsake all that he has cannot be My disciple." Luke 14:27, 33.

Imagine a teenager who says, "I want to be a doctor..." That teenager will have to make good grades to get into a good university. That same student will then have to take very hard classes in college while making good grades. After graduation from the university level the demands only increase. One must pass entrance exams to be admitted to medical school. Then after years of schooling, numerous hours of clinical training will one graduate only to have to do an internship before being allowed to take their licensing board examination. Many give up along the way thinking the demands simply too great. Those who persevere are rewarded with well-deserved respect and financial reward.

Jesus used two illustrations relevant to His time. One was a person who intended to build a tower. Jesus said that such a person had to count the cost if he had enough financial resources to finish or else set himself up to be mocked. The other illustration was a king encountering another in battle. Would it be wise to engage in war with that king if he were outnumbered two-to-one? In doing so Jesus was expressly teaching the importance of one not only counting the cost now, but the value at the end.

Given the demands of discipleship does it make good sense for one to become a Christian? Is it worth it for one to give up earthly pleasures to be faithful to God? The writer of Hebrews said regarding Moses, "choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God than to enjoy the passing pleasures of sin, esteeming the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures in Egypt; for he looked to the reward." Hebrews 11:25–26. But is it worth it? "For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us."Romans 8:18.





I Want A Church That Meets My Needs

The statement made in the title is not only the desire of many in the religious world, but is becoming the philosophy of many Christians, because many of us are seeking a religion that "meets our needs." The phrase itself has virtually become a new religious term. Many persons praise or blame a particular congregation because it is or is not "meeting my needs." Let me hasten to say that if the phrase means that we need to satisfy spiritual hunger, then it is a good expression, for surely everyone ought to be in a Christian community where his/her deepest spiritual longings are being addressed. The voice of God needs to be heard through spiritual teaching, and we need opportunities to serve, love and be called to repentance. But being a part of the church to some means reaching for goals of "self actualization." So, if the church doesn't fulfill certain expectations, wants and preferences, they must move on to another emotional department store with different merchandise more appealing to their "tastes."

Sadly, and probably without realizing it, many congregations have gotten into thinking that "we have to do all these things and plan all the activities to meet people's needs so they won't leave." Consequently, well-meaning leaders have turned God's church into a merchandising institution. So, we promote this program and that program for this group and that group.

But, in my judgment, the system has become turned upside down from the way God intended it to be. Whatever happened to the attitude in a Christian's heart of "I'd like to be a part of this congregation because of what I can do to meet its needs?" When are we

most fulfilled? When our needs are met, or when we meet the needs of God's church on this earth? We ought to be a part of a congregation not so our needs can be met, but rather so we may best meet the needs of God's work.

Christians need to recall the Truth of the Scriptures that personal fulfillment is a great spiritual paradox. We are most filled when we empty ourselves and be filled serving others. Jesus taught us, "...whosever will be great among you, let him be your minister (servant)...even as the son of man came not to be ministered unto, but to minister (serve)" (Matthew 20:26-28).

Paul said of his own heart, "I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave Himself for me" (Galatians 2:20). And again, "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service" (Romans 12:1). "Reasonable service" is not being served (having your needs met) but serving (meeting the needs of others). We need to relearn the axiom, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35).

Let's not demand that God's church be a place where people (leadership or membership) cater to our desires and preferences. Let's turn it right side up again and be a part of a congregation, not for what it can do for us, but for what we can do for it!

The Power Of One

During the War Between the States, a young woman learned the truth and obeyed the gospel. Her sweetheart, I.H. Halbrook, was a confederate soldier. He was captured by the union army and kept a prisoner in Michigan until the war was over. He was given a ticket to Nashville, TN and \$2.50. From there, he returned to Centerville and found what was left of his home and family. He found his girlfriend and they were married. His wife studied the Bible with him, and he soon became a Christian. He thought the truth was so good and so simple that he began to teach and baptize many of his friends and neighbors. He began to preach, but he recognized his need for more training, so he came to the original Mars Hill Bible School, taught by T.B. Larimore. Upon completing his studies there, instead of going back to Tennessee, they moved farther south, coming into Walker, Marion, Fayette, and Lamar counties in Alabama. One of his many converts was Charley Alexander Wheeler. His wife taught



him to read from the Bible. Along with his wife, C.A. Wheeler obeyed the gospel and soon began preaching to others. He started more than 100 congregations and baptized more than 6,000 people. But wait, the story is not ended! One of those 6,000 was my father, the late Gus Nichols. Twelve thousand were baptized under his preaching. Among those baptized by Gus Nichols, no one knows, nor can know, how many began to preach "the glorious gospel of Christ" (2Cor. 4:3,4); but I personally know several. I, Flavil Nichols, am ONE whom he baptized and whom he encouraged to preach the truth. And under my preaching, about three thousand have been baptized. A few among them preached the gospel also!

Only eternity can reveal the total results of the conversion of that one girl nearly one hundred and fifty years ago. The results are not yet all in! But this shows that TWENTY-ONE THOUSAND people have become Christians through this single thread in the fabric of her influence.

"Go, and do likewise" (Luke 10:37). YOU are important, too! Dear reader, if you go to heaven, others probably will be saved by you! "For what knowest thou, O wife, whether thou shalt save thy husband? Or how knowest thou, O man, whether thou shalt save try wife" (I Cor. 7:16)? "Let you light so shine before men, that they may see you good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven" (Matt. 5:16). Each ONE is very important.



The Scourge Of Secularism

What is "secularism"? Collins English Dictionary defines it as "a system of social organization and education where religion is not allowed to play a part in civil affairs." The American Heritage Dictionary defines it as "the view that religious consideration should be excluded from civil affairs and public education." "Secularism" is impacting America! We know that there are powers, overtly and covertly, working to remove all references to and influences of "religion" from our society. The Bible is not allowed in our schools. Evolution is touted; creation is mocked. Every form of immorality is promoted; morality is belittled. Situation ethic reigns supreme; biblical morality is called "a thing of the past." "You have your truth and I have my truth." "There are no absolutes!" "Everyone is right; no one is wrong." "Everything is right; nothing is wrong." Therefore, "every man does what is right in his own eyes" (Deuteronomy 12:8).

The toxicity of "secularism" is destroying the America we love. Our society is becoming more "secular" all of the time. Many now call our country "a Post-Christian Nation." Most religious organizations (churches) are in decline. Membership, attendance and involvement are down. How bad is it? The Barna Group recently published these facts:

- 1) "Nearly two-fifths of the nation's adult population (38%) now qualifies as post-Christian..."
- 2) "In other words, in spite of our 'Christian' self-descriptions, more than one-third of America's adults are essentially secular in belief and practice."
- 3) "Twenty years ago two-thirds of churchless Americans (65%) were open to being invited to church by a friend. Today, that percentage has slipped to less than half (47%)."
- 4) "Church-going is slowly but incontrovertibly losing its role as a normative part of American life."
- 5) "When the unchurched were asked to describe what they believe are the positive and negative contributions in America, almost half (49%) could not identify a single favorable impact of the Christian community..."
- 6) "The younger the generation, the more post-Christian it is. Nearly half of the Millennials (48%) qualify as post-Christian..." (www.barna.com/research/five-trends-among-the-unchurched/)

How is the "secularization" of America affecting the Lord's church? Many of our congregations are admittedly in decline, in membership and attendance. Church growth is more than a challenging in a society saturated with religious indifference. While we are alarmed, we must stay the course! We must hold to the truth, faithfully proclaim and live it!

One of the most troubling things is how "secular" many members of the church have become. For example, when given the choice between attending a ball game, a concert, a family reunion or a recital instead of being at worship, it is "no problem" for those who are "secular." Tell them that they are "secular," not "spiritual," and they will become angry! But it is true! Merriam-Webster defines "secularism" as "indifference to or rejection or exclusion of religion and religious consideration." When one is indifferent to, rejects and/or excludes the will of God things of the world, he or she is secular! "Secular" is just another name for "worldly." Are you seeking "first" the kingdom of God and His righteousness (Matthew 6:33)? We need to stifle this terrible scourge!







The Bed Is Too Short and the Covers Too Narrow

"Wherefore hear the word of the Lord, ye scornful men, that rule this people which is in Jerusalem. Because ye have said, We have made a covenant with death, and with hell are we at agreement; when the overflowing scourge shall pass through, it shall not come unto us: for we have made lies our refuge, and under falsehood have we hid ourselves: Therefore thus saith the Lord God, Behold, I lay in Zion for a foundation a stone, a tried stone, a precious corner stone, a sure foundation: he that believeth shall not make haste. Judgment also will I lay to the line, and righteousness to the plummet: and the hail shall sweep away the refuge of lies, and the waters shall overflow the hiding place. And your covenant with death shall be disannulled, and your agreement with hell shall not stand; when the overflowing scourge shall pass through, then ye shall betrodden down by it. From the time that it goeth forth it shall take you: for morning by morning shall it bass over, by day and by night; and it shall be a vexation only to understand the report. For the bed is shorter than that a man can stretch himself on it: and the covering narrower than that he can wrap himself in it" (Isaiah 28:14-20).

Israel had departed from God and was comfortable in her sins. God sent a warning by the prophet Isaiah to warn Israel relative to their sinful condition. They had made a "covenant with death" that the destruction that was coming would not affect them. God, however, had "disannulled" their covenant. Relative to their condition, God said; "For the bed is shorter than that a man can stretch himself on it: and the covering narrower than that he can wrap himself in it" (Isaiah 28:20).

The bed was too short and the cover was too narrow! Have you ever tried to sleep on a bed that was so short you could not stretch yourself upon it? Have you ever tried to cover yourself with covering that was too narrow? Now, have you ever had both of these conditions at the same time? It would be a cramped and cold situation! Judgment was coming upon Israel. Within in few decades of Isaiah's prophesy, Assyria came against Israel and took them into captivity.

There is another judgment day coming. This is the final judgment in which all the nations will be gathered together before the judgment seat of Christ. "When the Son of man shall come in his glory, and all the holy angels with him, then shall he sit upon the throne of his glory" (Matthew 25:31). "For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ; that every one may receive the things done in his body, according to that he hath done, whether it be good or bad" (2Corinthians 5:10). Many will realize their bed is too short and their cover is too narrow. Who are some of these?

THOSE THAT DO NOT BELIEVE IN CHRIST

Atheists do not believe in God and consequently do not believe Christ is God. God had the Psalmist to write; "The fool hath said in his heart, There is no God. They are

corrupt, they have done abominable works, there is none that doeth good" (Psalm14:1).

Many of the Jews, though they believed in God, did not believe in Christ. John wrote; "He came unto his own, and his own received him not" (John 1:11). In fact, they had Christ crucified. But Jesus Christ rose from the dead and ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God! Their bed is too short and their cover is too narrow.

FAITH ONLY ADVOCATES

Many are the preachers who tell people believe in Christ and accept Him into their hearts and they will be saved. While the Bible does tell us that faith is essential to salvation, it is not the only condition for the remission of sins. Jesus tells us that we must also "repent." He said, "I tell you, Nay: but, except ye repent, ye shall all likewise perish" (Luke 13:3). One must confess Christ, "That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved. For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation" (Romans 10:9-10). And, one must "be baptized" in order to be saved. The Bible records, "Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of lesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost" (Acts 2:38). Jesus says; "He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be damned" (Mark 16:16). Those that have not obeyed what the Lord has said will find that their bed is too short and their cover is too narrow.

NOMINAL CHRISTIANS

"Nominal Christians" are those who are Christians in name only. Such "serve" Christ when it is convenient for them. These have no true convictions or dedication relative to serving God. They attend worship services when they want to instead out of deep devotion to God. They live lives that make them a "good - ole Joe", but not a faithful child of God. Such people need to be converted. Following Jesus requires surrender: "Then said Jesus unto his disciples, If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me" (Matthew 16:24). Every branch in Christ that doesn't bear fruit will be cut off, "I am the true vine, and my Father is the husbandman. Every branch in me that beareth not fruit he taketh away: and every branch that beareth fruit, he purgeth it, that it may bring forth more fruit"(John 15:1-2). Nominal Christians will find that their bed is too short and their cover is too narrow.

Let's make sure that our bed is made according to God's specifications. Then, and only then, can we lie down in peace and sleep. "I will both lay me down in peace, and sleep: for thou, LORD, only makest me dwell in safety" (Psalm 4:8).



Bare Season is Here Again

During bare season (summer months) worldly women (and men) are known for wearing as little clothing as possible. Women and girls come onto the streets in shorts and the briefest tops and to services in short skirts and low cut blouses. Men and boys work in their yards or go to softball fields or the track in brief shorts without even a shirt. Both genders go to beaches in attire inappropriate in any place but the bedroom. There seems to be little thought given to modesty, the effect our dress can have on others, or to our positive Christian example.

The Lord said, whosoever looketh on a woman to lust after her hath committed adultery with her already in his heart (Matthew 5:28). The principle not to lust applies to men and women, of course, but the Lord knew this temptation was stronger for males. At the same time, the girl or woman who openly displays herself in immodest dress is accountable for enticing lust. Women are instructed to be careful to adorn themselves in modest apparel, in shamefacedness, and sobriety (1 Timothy 2:9).

We sin if we become a stumbling block to others (I Corinthians 8:9). Jesus said, whoso shall offend one of these little ones which believe in me, it were better for him that a millstone were hanged about his neck, and that he were drowned in the depth of the sea (Matthew 18:6). Our manner of dress may well be a good indication of the depth of our spirituality. Christians are to be good examples in manner of life and in purity (I Timothy 4:12). Our Christian example can be ruined by inappropriate dress as quickly as by drinking, smoking, or using foul language.

Let each of us dress so that if we met Christ on the street we would not blush with shame!





Please remember that we as a group of Christians are a reflection of Christ no matter where we go. We can reflect Christ with our words, actions and by our choice of clothing. Please keep this in mind when you are choosing your outfit for this trip.

The Name of the Church

On one occasion, Leonard Johnson, one of the founders of what is now Faulkner University in Montgomery, Alabama, was preaching in a gospel meeting in a small Alabama town. One night he preached a sermon on the church. In the midst of his sermon brother Johnson said, "Now within the next four to five minutes I am going to tell you everything the New Testament says about the name of the church." For the next four to five minutes brother Johnson was completely silent. He did not utter a word. Then he said, "There you have it — everything the New Testament says about the name of the church!"

Brother Johnson was absolutely right—the church, the body of people redeemed to God by the blood of Christ, does not have a proper, formal, exclusive, and patented name! It was not and is not a denomination and does not wear a denominational designation. Instead, the New Testament gives numerous descriptors for the church. The church (the aggregate of all who have been saved by obedience to the gospel) is the spiritual body of Christ, of which there is but one (Eph. 1:22-23; 4:4). It is the spiritual temple of God, being composed of living stones (Eph. 2:19-22; I Pet. 2:4-5). It is the house (household, family) of God, with every child of God a member of it (ITim. 3:15; Heb. 3:5-6). It is the kingdom of God's dear Son (Col. 1:13; cf. Acts 2:47). Christ, in promising to build it, called in "my church" (Matt. 16:18). A plurality of local congregations are designated as "churches of Christ" (Rom. 16:16). At the same time, they also are described as "churches of God" (I Cor. 11:26), and the universal body of redeemed people is called the "church of God" (v. 22). Geographically, the people of God are spoken of as the church at Jerusalem, the church of God which is at Corinth, the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord lesus Christ, the churches of ludea, the churches of Galatia, the seven churches of Asia, etc. Modern Catholic and Protestant names are noticeably absent from the New Testament, and came to be applied to religious groups arising this side of the **New Testament!**

Churches of Christ today strive to be churches of the New Testament order. We do not profess to be a denomination. The use of the biblical descriptor "church of Christ" is not intended as our "official, exclusive, denominational name." Any biblical descriptor is acceptable. However, in our sadly divided religious world, it is practical to use rather consistently a descriptor that sets forth in a scriptural way those who

are pleading for a return to the undenominational church of the New Testament and who are contending for "the faith which was once for all delivered to the saints" (Jude 3).

Clearly, it is possible to use a biblical designation for the church in a sectarian and denominational sense and, sadly, many are doing that with the descriptor "church of Christ." At the same time, to use this scriptural designation does not make those using it a denomination.

Many years ago, the late Cled Wallace made some insightful observations about the "name" of the church that we would do well to consider today. He wrote: "Now I am somewhat of a stickler for calling the church anything and everything it is called in the New Testament and have said so over and over again in these and other columns . . . I am certain that the expression 'church of Christ' has been used in a sectarian sense, but not when it is applied to the right thing, however often it may be used. It is misused only when it is employed to cover too little or too much or applied to something that is not it at all . . . Brethren keep me more uneasy sometimes by what they mean by it than they do by how often they say it" (Bible Banner, Volume IV, Number II, September 1941).

Let me say again: I am not Church of Christ (viewed as a denomination) in my religious affiliation. I am not a Church of Christ (viewed as a denomination) preacher - no more so than I am a Church of God (viewed as a denomination) preacher, or a body of Christ preacher, of a kingdom of God's dear Son preacher, or a temple of God preacher, or any of the other biblical descriptors for the people of God that may be corrupted into a denominational name or employed in a sectarian sense. At the same time, I am a member of Christ's church, the Lord's church, the body of Christ, the household of God. I can be such without being a member of any denomination. So can anyone else. Local churches can be churches of Christ without being a denomination. There are many of us who are Christians only without denominational affiliation, members only of what the New Testament most frequently designates simply as "the church."





Does God Hear Sinners When They Pray?

In John 9 we read the marvelous story of Jesus healing a man that had been blind from birth. The Pharisees interrogated the man, seeking to dismiss the impact of the miracle. They told the man that Jesus was a sinner. The man responded, "One thing I know: that though I was blind, now I see" (verse 25). The Pharisees only counter was to denigrate the man. As to the matter of Jesus being a sinner, the man who had been blind said, "Now we know that God does not hear sinners; but if anyone is a worshiper of God and does His will, He hears him" (verse 31).

The common view today is that God hears everyone when they pray, but is that true? Was the man who had been blind correct in his assessment? Let the Bible answer!

- "If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear" (Psalm 66:18).
- "The Lord is far from the wicked, but He hears the prayers of the righteous" (Proverbs 15:29).
- "One who turns away his ear from hearing the law, even his prayer is an abomination" (Proverbs 28:9).
- "Behold, the Lord's hand is not shortened, that it cannot save; nor His ear heavy that He cannot hear. But your iniquities have separated you from your God, and your sins have hidden His face from you, so that He will not hear" (Isaiah 59:1-2).
- "For 'He who would love life and see good days, let him refrain his tongue from evil, and his lips from speaking deceit. Let him turn away from evil and do good; let him seek peace and pursue it. For the eyes of the Lord are on the righteous, and His ears are open to their prayers; but the face of the Lord is against those who do evil" (I Peter 3:10-12).

Prayer is a covenant privilege, i.e., for those who are children of God. What a tremendous privilege! In the words of the man once blind, let us be a "worshiper of God" and one who "does His will." It is then that we can "come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need" (Hebrews 4:16).







They are set in their negative, critical attitude toward the church, and really have no interest in changing. To them the only real scholars are those among the denominations, and the older preachers and scholars of the restoration movement are ridiculed by them. "Ephraim is joined to idols: let him alone" (Hos. 4:17).

9/11 and Remembrance

As was the case with the assassination of John F. Kennedy, many vividly remember where they were when they got news of the attacks on September 11, 2001. I remember where I was. I had been told about the first attack so went home to see it unfold on the television. Brother Garland Elkins had called to see if I could recommend a good brother to help save the school money with the landscaping around the newly built Forest Hill church of Christ and Memphis School of Preaching. While on the phone with him the second plane hit the twin towers of the World Trade Center. I sat there with shock and disbelief. Brother Elkins remarked about the evil in this world that would seek to harm his fellow man.

This makes me think of two things:

- 1. There were at least two great events in the history of man where that great enemy Satan sought to inflict harm on mankind. At the beginning he was a tempter that introduced sin into the world with the temptation of Eve. That great event for ever changed the future of mankind, for death entered in with that sin (Rom. 5:12). The other great event was when the Devil persuaded the Jews of the first century to kill our Lord. We remember that second event every first day of the week (1Cor. 11:25-26). That event also forever changed the world. In contrast to the first event it brought hope through the sacrifice of Jesus and His resurrection.
- 2. The horrific event of 9/11 reminds me that the Lord's way is better and higher than all others. The believers in Islam are taught to inflict harm on their enemies. Yet, our Lord said, "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, love your enemies, bless those who curse you, do good to those who hate you, and pray for those who spitefully use you and persecute you," Matthew 5:43–44. The Lord brought light into a world of darkness.

Let us remember the event and reflect on the blessing we have to have a Savior to delivers us from this world of darkness.

John Wooden was the legendary head coach of the UCLA basketball team. Known as the "Wizard of Westwood," Coach Wooden led his team to ten NCAA national championships in a 12-year period. At one point his teams won 88 consecutive games and seven national championships in a row. Wooden was named national coach of the year six times. There were, of course, many components in his teams' success: great players, dedication, determination, preparation, great coaching and motivation. The revered coach observed, "Little things make big things happen." Wooden followed that philosophy on the hardwood. He was even known for teaching his players how to put on their socks! What is interesting, however, is that this quote was made in reference to life - not just life on the basketball court. "Little things make big things happen."







Shepherds

"Shepherd" is the best word to describe the role of an elder. Elders are not business managers, a mere management team. Elders do not compose a corporate board. We often pray, "Lord, bless the elders in the decisions they make." While decision-making is inherent to their role (any role in the church), elders are much more than decision-makers. Elders are shepherds! We should pray, "Lord, please bless the elders as they shepherd the flock."

When Paul meet with the elders of the Ephesus congregation (Acts 20:17), he exhorted, "Therefore take heed to yourselves and to all the flock, among which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to shepherd the church of God which He purchased with His own blood" (verse 28, emphasis mine, DF). Elders are "overseers." Thayer says that the original word (episkopos) refers to "a man charged with the duty of seeing that things to be done by others are done rightly." [This word is sometimes translated "bishop." An elder is a bishop and a bishop is an elder - one in the same.] Elders are "shepherds." Thayer says that the original word (poimaino) means "to tend a flock." ["Poimanio" is from the root word "poimen," a pastor or shepherd. The elders are the "pastors" or "shepherds" of the flock, not the preacher. The "pastor concept" in the denominational world is not found in the Bible.] When Peter addressed elders, he emphasized the same two roles. He exhorted, "Shepherd the flock of God which is among you, serving as overseers, not by compulsion but willingly, not for dishonest gain but eagerly; nor as being lords over those entrusted to you, but being examples to the flock; and when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory that does not fade away" (I Peter 5:2-3, emphasis mine, DF).

As just noted, elders are not "lords." They do not "legislate" – make laws. They "expedite" – guide us in following God's laws. They go before us and serve as "examples to the flock." Simply put, they watch for our souls! Hebrews 13:17 provides great insight into their role and our relationship to them. The Hebrews' writer exhorted, "Obey those who have the rule over you, and be submissive, for they watch out for your souls, as those who must give

account. Let them do so with joy and not with grief, for that would be unprofitable for you."

We are to "obey" (action) and "be submissive" (attitude) to the elders – Hebrews 13:17. We are to "honor" them (value, esteem and treat them with dignity) – I Timothy 5:17. We are not to unjustly "criticize" them or listen to the same – I Timothy 5:19. How blessed any congregation is to to have qualified and faithful, committed and loving men who lead them! Elders, shepherd us! Brothers and sisters, fol-low the shepherds! "Let them do so with joy and not with grief, for that would be unprofitable for you."





Who Cares?

Have you ever felt as though no one love you...no one cared about you? David must have been in the depths of despair when he wrote: "No one cares for my soul" (Psalms 142:4). While earthly friends may sometimes fail to care as they should, we can be sure that someone does care about us. "Who cares?," you ask. Notice carefully that:

- **I. ANGELS CARE.** The scriptures demonstrate that angelic beings are concerned with our welfare. Jesus said, "there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner that repents..." (Luke 15:10). From I Peter I:12 observe that angels are concerned with the salvation of mankind. Angels care!
- 2. JESUS CARES. A well-known hymn asks, "Does Jesus care?" The refrain answers, "O yes, He cares; I know He cares..." Jesus, the loving shepherd, laid down his life because he cared for his sheep (John 10:13,14). "Greater love hath no man than this, than a man lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13). Truly, Jesus is one who cares for us.
- **3. OUR HEAVENLY FATHER CARES.** The giving of His only begotten son shows the extent of God's great love (John 3:16). Indeed he is "the father of mercies and God of all comfort" (2 Corinthians 1:3). Paul said that "God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8).

When you are depressed, lonely and feeling as though no one cares, do as David did, turn to God in prayer. He prayed saying: "I cried out to You, O Lord; I said, 'You are my refuge..." (Psalms 142:5). Remember that there are those who care!



The Need To Blush

"Were they ashamed when they had committed abomination? nay, they were not at all ashamed, neither could they blush: therefore they shall fall among them that fall: at the time that I visit them they shall be cast down, saith the Lord" (Jer. 6:15).

One of the indicators that a conscience is sensitive to sin is blushing. A good conscience takes no pride in sin. When sinful things do not produce a sorrowful reaction in the life of a person, especially a Christian, then something is seriously wrong. Jeremiah spoke to people who had no remorse over the abominable things taking place in and among them. Without a sense of guilt and shame, men do not see the need for help and correction. Think about some things today that demand the need to blush.

Dress

The first recorded reaction of man when sin entered the world was shame. "And the eyes of them both were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together, and made themselves aprons" (Gen. 3:7). The consciences of Adam and Eve were very sensitive. Though their apparel was inadequate, they did not see the need to be covered. Consider this in light of Paul's words to Timothy: "In like manner also, that women adorn themselves in modest apparel, with shamefacedness and sobriety; not with braided hair, or gold, or pearls, or costly array" (I Tim. 2:9). Underscore the word, "shamefacedness." Shamefacedness is the attitude that Adam and Eve had. When this attitude declines, modesty also declines. There is no doubt that the promiscuousness of today has had a vast influence on modest dress. The prevalence of immodesty does not show God's approval of such. Modesty is a moral issue and morals have not changed from the beginning of time. When a person wears little more than his undergarments and does not blush, then he or she is in the same state as those in Jeremiah's day.

Dialogue

There was a day in which vulgarity and profanity were offensive and disgusting to people. Today, one can hardly go through a day without hearing something that is base and immoral. There is a danger that Christians might be calloused toward bad language and lack of taking the proper stand because such is commonplace in society. The light of some has greatly dimmed or even been extinguished because of participation in worldly conversation. James said, "Out of the same mouth proceedeth blessing and cursing. My brethren, these things ought not so to be" (Jam. 8:10). Paul wrote, "Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good to the use of edifying, that it may minister grace unto the hearers" (Eph. 4:29). The words of one's mouth declare the purity of one's heart. A Christian finds nothing amusing in language that promotes wickedness.

Demeanor

The activities of today must be viewed with discretion. One needs only to read Judges 17:6 to see what happens when people do that which is right in their own eyes. Dancing, drinking, mixed swimming and the like are not activities which Christians desire to participate in. It is no wonder that Paul told Timothy, "Let no man despise thy youth; but be thou an example of the believers, in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity" (I Tim. 4:12). There is a great need that people in the church be examples to each other. One can never expect to make an impact on the immorality of the world when members of the church do not blush over ungodly activities. The Christian life is one of decency and honor. May all seek to develop a conscience that is always ashamed of sin.



Is It Not Worth The Effort?

So often, the old Devil seeks to discourage us by hindering the Lord's work. He is a master at discouraging the brethren. He knows every trick and every ploy. So often, godly saints want to quit and say, "It is not worth the effort."

Often elders grow discouraged because sheep stray and reject all efforts to restore them. Many members could not care less that brethren grow weak and die spiritually, so they become grounds of discouragement by hindering the reclamation and discipline of lost members. Elders often feel: "it is not worth the effort."

Often, deacons grow discouraged because so few will cooperate with them in getting the job done. Other deacons do not bear their fair share of the load and this discourages too. They say, "It is not worth the effort."

Often, Bible school teachers grow discouraged. Students do not study their lessons, and if comments are made, half are wrong or off the point! Many act as if Bible study is an "optional expedient" instead of "growth unto salvation." Then the old expression arises, "It is not worth the effort."

Often, preachers despair. People often fail to react as they should to the Word. Preacher's words and actions are often misunderstood, misrepresented, or actually opposed, so he becomes discouraged. After years of study, application and faithful service, a handful of brethren can destroy the preacher's work by getting the ear of the eldership, so the preacher says, "It is not worth the effort."

All of us have felt this on occasions about something we are doing for the Lord's cause. But through it all we must remember that what we do, we do for God! Many times, it takes tremendous effort to persevere in our work in the kingdom. Only those who have been there really understand the unremitting toil, sacrifice, time, and effort, and even money it takes to continually achieve for the Master (in any of the above roles). No one else may even notice, much less sympathize or help.

But God notices. God cares. God is concerned, and God will ultimately make it right. It may not be worth the effort if it is for money we serve or for favor or popularity or for any of a hundred other reasons. But for God it is worth it!





Why Church Membership Is Declining

There was a time in America's rich history when church buildings were bursting at the seams because of the vast number of devoted members in attendance. On any given Sunday, churches of all sorts would, without question, be filled with attendees. Now, statistically speaking, if a congregation has an average weekend attendance of 51-300, they are considered to be a "large church." Recent statistics further show that in a population of 110,000, only around 8,000 attend a "church" on a given Sunday; that is less than 10%. There has been major decline in church attendance in the past few decades. While there are many contributing factors in this epidemic, consider five major reasons why church attendance is declining:

FIRST, MANY CHRISTIANS ARE DISTRACTED. There are simply too many Christian's who are preoccupied with the things of the world. God's children can attend ball-games, go fishing and hunting, but they cannot assemble with the saints. Most stores are open on Sundays, and many Christians will work or shop instead of worship God. There are also many city events, concerts, and other events held on Sundays and at other worship times. On top of all this, television programs air popular shows during many of the times God's people would gather for worship. Therefore, when it is time for the church to assemble together, many of God's people are too cumbered by the world, and their place in the pew is left vacant. However, Jesus clearly warned about the dangers of being consumed by the cares of this world (Mark 4:18-19).

SECOND, WE HAVE LOWERED THE STANDARD. In yesteryear, a person was considered an active church member if they attended three services a week. Now, an individual is measured to be an active member if they attend three services a month. God's people have lowered the standard somewhere along the line, and many have convinced themselves they can be faithful even though they give God very little. However, God has not lowered His standard. He still demands full devotion, and He still expects faithful attendance as a display of genuine commitment to Him (Hebrews 10:24-25).

THIRD, MANY CONGREGATIONS ARE INWARD FOCUSED. When a congregation becomes consumed with themselves, and they forget their overall purpose, the attendance will decline. The mission of the church is saving souls (Matthew 28:18-20), not satisfying the flesh. Thus, when a congregation becomes enamored with meeting everyone's physical needs, their attendance will decline. Attendance may momentarily spike, but people will eventually have their entertainment and social needs met elsewhere. When this happens, consumer-minded members, created by the inward focus congregation, will no longer need "church."

FOURTH, THERE IS NO VISION. A congregation cannot survive if they spend a decade remembering the past and have no vision for the future. However, this is the very state of many congregations. They have been reflecting upon their "glory days" for decades with no plans, goals, and objectives for the future. Over the years, death has slowly reduced their membership. The congregation is now older, and the pews are nearly totally occupied by grey heads. Now, their membership is much lower, involvement is far less, and their attendance is a mere fraction of what it used to be. If we want to combat the loss of membership and great decline in attendance, great men of vision need to fill our elderships. They need to know where they are going, decide what it takes to get there, and put forth the effort to reach their objectives. "Where there is no vision, the people perish" (Proverbs 29:18).

FOURTH, THERE HAS BEEN A LACK OF ACCOUNTABILITY. When unfaithfulness goes unchecked, people fall between the cracks, and there is no accountability for sin, attendance will continue to drop in the local congregation. Imagine the number of sermons which have been preached on the importance of attendance, the sin of forsaking the assembly, and the dangers of not gathering with God's people over the past few decades. However, we are witnessing a major decline in attendance all throughout our land. What good are sermons preached on this issue without accountability? How can elderships expect these sermons to be heeded by the flock when the flock is not held accountable? Far too many Christians come and go as they wish, and very little is done to correct the problem in the lives of these individuals. More times than not, these Christians "fall between the cracks" while elderships worry over planning the next potluck, heating and cooling the meetinghouse, and making sure the church lawn is mowed. If we want to change the decline in attendance, it will take elders who truly "shepherd the flock of God" (I Peter 5:2). There has to be accountability between the shepherds and the sheep.



Singing Songs in Worship

Song leaders are responsible for setting the tone for much of a congregation's worship. They select the songs that they believe will help a congregation to worship the Lord most fully, effectively and meaningfully. A song leader's primary responsibility is to help worshipers to enter into the presence of God, and to acceptably and heartily praise God.

As with all men who lead the church in its worship, a song leader must remember that it is not about him, but about God! The songs that he selects should be appropriate to the congregation and to the worship assembly. The song leader is merely the conduit by which a congregation is led to worship the Lord in song, which means if the singing portion of worship is misdirected and focuses on him (for whatever reason) instead of on heaven, the worship is no longer flowing through him but is being impeded by him. That's the last thing any sincere worship leader desires.

So, what about the singers? What about the worshiper? Too often some singers/worshipers spend more time criticizing and questioning the song leader (ex: his selection of songs, his style, his directing, his ability, etc.) than they do actually worshiping God. But the song selection and the song leading are not the worshipers' job. Their job is to worship! Their job is to sing "with grace in [their] hearts to the Lord" (Col. 3:16) and to "offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips" (Heb. 13:15). So, as a singer, as a worshiper, how

can I do my job of singing to the Lord and worshiping Him "in spirit and in truth" (John 4:24) better? Try this:

- I. Accept that the song which the leader is singing has been already selected...and move on. What does rolling your eyes or even stewing about it accomplish?
- 2. Set your heart on worshiping God in that song! That's the whole purpose!
- 3. Capture quickly in your mind the overall theme of the song. What is this song about? Is it about praise, about Jesus' love, about the cross, about the Christian life, etc.? Know what you're singing.
- 4. Focus your heart on every word and phrase of the song, and truly contemplate and mean them when they come from your lips.
- 5. Try to sing parts. Try to follow along with whatever part fits you the best—i.e., soprano, alto, tenor or bass.
- 6. Listen to others as they sing around you and earnestly try to worship together and to sing to one another.
- 7. Remember that God is looking at and listening to your heart in every song. That's truly what matters the most!

One Simple Life Changing Decision

Eve looked at that beautiful, forbidden fruit and made a decision. There was no way she could begin to visualize how that one decision would change the history of the world. The choice made that day has impacted the lives of every one of the billions and billions of people who have lived on this earth. It impacts the lives of each of us.

There are other examples in the Bible of innocent choices which changed the course of the rest of the lives of those who made them. When Jacob decided to send Joseph, wearing his coat of many colors, to check on his brothers it seemed like such a minor matter. Yet, it was the last time the patriarch would see his son for almost four decades. One simple decision which changed the lives of Jacob and his descendants for thousands of years.

In the last few months, two of the members at the Palm Beach Lakes church of Christ have made simple decisions which have changed their lives. Drastically changed their lives. Eternally changed their lives.

Months ago, every member was challenged to commit themselves to being present every time the doors of the church were opened this year. One couple made that choice. At that time, the husband was not a member of the church. It is remarkable what happened. Faith comes from hearing the word of God (Rom. 10:17), and the word of God implanted in this man's heart began to grow and grow. Two weeks ago, he obeyed the gospel. His life was changed. Three weeks ago, I was talking with another member at Palm Beach Lakes. I had baptized him into Christ at least thirty years ago. His work interfered with his ability to come regularly. His spiritual growth stagnated. He was a member here, but not an active one. His work situation has changed, and he recently made a decision to start attending more. Last week, we talked again, and he said that this decision had changed him. He was so much happier and was now closer to God than he had ever been. He said, "It has changed me. My heart is so different."

Think about these two men who have been changed. Is your faith as strong as you want it to be? Are you where you really want to be? Faith comes from hearing God's word, and stronger faith comes from hearing God's word more. Is there an innocent decision you should make? Think about it!


